

OHS Risk Assessment and Control Procedure including Safe Working Procedures for Staff and Students of UNSW

Aim:

To provide a 2.5 hour training course on the methodology for completing OHS risk assessments and safe working procedures for staff and students at UNSW. The course presents participants with the 10 step UNSW Risk Assessment and Control System and its relationship to Safe Working Procedures, provide one worked example and then to assist participants in specific examples related to their field of work.

Target Group:

All staff and students of UNSW who are responsible for completing risk assessments and safe working procedures.

Course Duration and Cost:

The course is two and one-half hours. There is no cost for participants in this course.

Course Competency:

Competency will be determined by the completion of a risk assessment and a safe working procedure. A certificate of attendance may be issued on request.

Course Presenters:

The course presenters are the OHS Coordinators from the OHS&WC Unit.

- use the UNSW 10 step risk assessment and control process
- identify hazards
- assess and rate risks using the UNSW Risk Rating Procedure

- complete the UNSW Safe Working Procedure Form OHS026
